Children learn ways of communicating with others from their parents as they grow up. Thus, when your child grows in an environment of constant emotional blackmailing, it can cause stunted social and emotional growth in them. Emotional blackmailing can have serious effects on your child's mental health. It can make them stressed and anxious and may cause depression later in their life.
